## James Biggar Grange Farm, Castle Douglas

James and his family run a 1,500ac mixed farm producing Pedigree Shorthorn and Aberdeen Angus Cattle, and Cheviot Mule cross-bred sheep. The farm runs around 360 cows and 750 ewes, and they grow approximately 140ac of cereals for their own use.

Whitmuirhaugh Farm is run by Jonny and his brother Charlie. Whitmuirhaugh encompasses around 500ac mixed grassland and arable with an additional 600ac of contract/share farm on neighbouring land. They have 75 cows to calve this year. Cows are all synchronised and fixed time Al'd, then run with an Aberdeen Angus bull for 8 weeks. Al bulls are a mix of Aberdeen Angus, Simental, Limousin and Hereford. Jonny is a strong



believer in collaboration. He works closely with his brother-in-law, Murray Potts, at Shidlaw.
