Definitions

'Flock' A batch of animals that are managed in complete isolations and have had no contact with any other animals on the holding for 12 months or more, including other flocks of accredited animals.

'Group' A group of animals within a flock that have been managed separately for a minimum of two months other than mixing with other groups for management practices such as lambing, tupping and routine treatments for example.

Routine Periodic Blood Tests

- The proportion size must be worked out based on the number of animals in the flock over the age of 18 months (see below) and should include **ALL males over 18 months used in the current and most recent breeding season**. Any animals purchased since the last RPBT and not tested should be excluded from this calculation.

For ALL EAE Tests:

- **Ewes should be blood tested within 3 months after lambing**
- Test **ONLY** ewes that have bred
- There is no need to test ewes identified as barren at scanning
- Aborted ewes **MUST** be identified and tested prior to disposal or retention

Johne's disease Annual Test:

All animals aged 12 months and over to be tested annually. Note that when testing added animals you must supply both blood and faeces unless the animals are from Risk Level 1 flocks/herds – they do not require to be tested into the flock/herd.
